Generation One

1. Kamehameha I [1795-1819] was born in 1736 in Kokoiki, North Kohala, Hawai'i, KOH. He married first to Kalola (w), daughter of Kumuko'a (k) High Chief of Moloka'i, in 1766. He married second to Kalolawahilani-a-Kumuko'a (w) in 1766. He married third to Kekuaipi'ia (w), daughter of Ke'eumokupapaiahehe (k) and Nāmāhana (w), in 1766. He married fourth to Kānekapōlei (w), daughter of Kauakahiakua (k) and 'Umieamoku (w), in 1767. He married fifth to Peleuli (w), daughter of Kumuko'a (k) High Chief of Moloka'i and Kaulahoa (w), in 1767. He married sixth to Kauhilanimaka (w). He married seventh to Kahailiopua (w).

He married eighth to Wahine Pālama (w). He married ninth to Mauna[kal]lika (w). He married tenth to Kalaninuikauko'olua'ole (w). He married eleventh to High Chiefess Ka'ahumanu (w), daughter of Ke'eumokupapaiahehe (k) and Nāmāhana (w), in 1785. He married twelfth to Keku'iapo'iwa Liliha (w), daughter of Keōuakupuapāikalani nui (k) and Kalola (w) High Chiefess of Maui, in 1790; [No issue]. He married thirteenth to Kalanikauikikilokalaniakua (w); [No issue]. He married fourteenth to Keohohiwa (w), daughter of Keaweāheulu (k) and Ululani (w); [No issue]. He married fifteenth to Kekikipua (w); [No issue]. He married sixteenth to Ka'akaupalahalaha (w), daughter of Kaiakea (k) High Priest and King of Moloka'i and Kalanipo'o-a-Peleioholani (w), in 1794 in Moloka'i, KOH. He married seventeenth to Keōpūolani (w), daughter of Kalanikauikeaouli Kiwala'ō (k) and Keku'iapo'iwa Liliha (w), in 1796.

He married eighteenth to Kaheiheimāile (w), daughter of Ke'eumokupapaiahehe (k) and Nāmāhana (w), in 1799. He married nineteenth to Kai (w) between 1799 to 1809; [No issue]. He married twentieth to Kahoa (w) between 1799 to 1809; [No issue]. He married twenty-first to Kahakuha'akoi (w), daughter of Kekuamanohā (k) and Kamakahukilani (w), between 1799 to 1809. He married twenty-second to Kikipa'a (w) between 1799 to 1809; [No issue]. He married twenty-third to Kamaeokalani (w). He married twenty-fourth to Auhea Kekāuluohi (w), daughter of High Chief

identified by Abraham Fornander as a wife of Kamehameha I (k). "Kamehameha took his uncle's (Kalaniōpu'u) advice and in company with his wife Kalola, his brother Kalaimamahu and the god Ka'ili, he left Ka'u and passing through Hilo, went to Halawa, his patrimonial estate in Kohala, where he remained until the death of Kalaniōpu'u." Peleulinui (w) was the principal wife of Kamehameha I (k) and all of her children were born before 1785 when Kamehameha I (k) married Ka'ahumanu (w) who was then his new principal wife.

The four known children of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Peleuli (w) all born in Kingdom of Hawai'i were as follows:

5. i. Kapulikoliko (w) married 'A'akalani (k). She married Luahiwa (k).

6. ii. Kaho'ānokū (k) married Kahakuha'akoi (w), daughter of Kekuamanohā (k) and Kamakahukilani (w). He died in 1808.

iii. Kaiko'okalani (k) was born; [Kamehameha's sixth child].

iv. Kiliwehi (w) was born; [Kamehameha's seventh child]. She married Kamehameha Keneka. She was also known as Kauwahine (w). She was also known as Likelike (w). Note: She may have been the daughter of Peleuli (w) and Kamehameha's half-brother, Kawelookalani (k).

Kauhilanimaka (w) was also known as Kahulilanimaka (w).

The only known child of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Kauhilanimaka (w) was:

7. i. Kahiwa2 Kānekapōlei (w) was born in Hilo, Hawai'i, KOH. She married Kaha'aulani (k), son of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Kānekapōlei (w). She married Namikiaiokalani (k).

The two known children of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Kahailiopua (w) both born in Kingdom of Hawai'i were as follows:

i. Keōua (k)2 was born; [Kamehameha's ninth child].

ii. Luahine (w) was born; [Kamehameha's tenth child].

Wahine Pālama (w) was also known as Ewaloa (w).

The two known children of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Wahine Pālama (w) were as follows:

i. Kapapauai I (w)2 was born in Kingdom of Hawai'i; [Kamehameha's eleventh child].

8. ii. Ha'aloa (k) was born in Hanapēpē, Kaua'i, KOH. He died on 10 May 1870 in Waimea, Kaua'i, KOH.

Mauna[kal]lika (w) was born circa 1775 in Kohala, Hawai'i, KOH. She died circa 1845 in Kohala, Hawai'i, KOH. She was also known as Maunalika (w). She was also known as Maunalika Kuamo'o 'Aha'ula (w).

The only known child of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Mauna[kal]lika (w) was:

9. i. Kaiwikuamo'o-o-kekuokalani (k)2 was born in Kohala, Hawai'i, KOH. He married Kamaka (w). He married Kaho'oluhi (w). He married Mahi'ali'ili'i (w). He married Lu'ukia (w). He died on 24 Dec 1819 in Keauhou Kona, Hawai'i, KOH.

Christian convert and wielded much Christian influence in governmental laws.

Buried at Mauna `Ala, Kamehameha crypt (`Ewa vault).
Kalanipauahi (w) married Kamehameha II [1819-1824], son of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Keōpūolani (w). She married Kekūanaō`a (k), son of Nāhi`ōle`a (k) and Inaina (w). She died on 9 Feb 1826. She was also known as Pauahi (w).

30. ii. Anna Keahikuni-i-Kekau`ōnohi was born in 1805 in Lahaina, Maui, KOH. She married first to Kamehameha II [1819-1824], son of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Keōpūolani (w). She married Keaupuni (k), son of John Keōua Pi`imoku Ha`alo`u and Malie Koloakea Māhoe. She married third to Chief Keli`iahonui (k), son of Ruling Chief Kaumuali`i (k) and Kapuaamamahu (w), circa 1833. She married second to Levi Ha`alele`a, son of Ha`alo`u (k) Governor of Moloka`i and Kaipa (w), in 1847. She died on 2 Jun 1851 in Honolulu, O`ahu, KOH.

7. Kahiwa2 Kānekapōlei (w) (1 Kamehameha I) was born in Hilo, Hawai`i, KOH; [Kamehameha's eighth child]. She married Kaha`aulani (k), son of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Kānekapōlei (w). She married Namikiaiokalani (k). She was also known as Kahiwa-Kānekapōlei (w). She was also known as Kaneikopulei (w). She was also known as Kanehiwakapolei (w). She was also known as Regina Kahiwa Kānekapōlei. Namikiaiokalani (k) was also known as Namiki (k). The two known children of Kahiwa2 Kānekapōlei (w) and Namikiaiokalani (k) were as follows:

i. Zepherin Kuhopu Kahoali`i Kame`eiamoku Kuikauwai3 Kepelino was born circa 1830 in Kailua-Kona, Hawai`i, KOH. He died in 1876.

31. ii. Puahau Kauhimakaoakalani Keanaokalani (w) married Ernest Pi`imauna. Kaha`aulani (k) was born circa 1767; [Kamehameha's third child]. The four known children of Kahiwa2 Kānekapōlei (w) and Kaha`aulani (k) were as follows:

i. `Ōhi`aku II (k)3 was born circa 1782 in Paliuli, Puna, Hawai`i, KOH. He married Kapaumealani (w), daughter of Kaha`aulani (k) and Kahiwa Kānekapōlei (w). (see # 26.).

ii. Kapaumealani (w) was born in Hālawā, Kohala, Hawai`i, KOH. She married `Ōhi`aku II (k), son of Kaha`aulani (k) and Kahiwa Kānekapōlei (w). (see # 27.).

iii. Kalamakuikeao Ka`ahiki (k) married Luhia (w), daughter of `Ōhi`aku II (k) and Kapaumealani (w), in Waipi`o, Hawai`i, KOH. He married Nakolo (w). (see # 28.).

iv. Honoululani (k/w). (see previous).

8. Ha`aloa (k)2 (1 Kamehameha I) was born in Hanapēpē, Kaua`i, KOH; [Kamehameha's twelfth child]. He died on 10 May 1870 in Waimea, Kaua`i, KOH.

He was also known as Pālama (k).

Known children of Ha`aloa (k)2 include:

Chiefess Deborah Kekaiha`akulou Kapule, daughter of Kahekili (k) and Hawea (w), circa 1822. He married High Chiefess Ka`ahumanu (w), daughter of Ke`eaumokupapaiahehe (k) and Nāmāhana (w), in 1825; [or 1821]. He died on 23 Jun 1849 in Honolulu, O`ahu, KOH, at age 48.

The only known child of Anna3 Keahikuni-i-Kekau`ōnohi and Chief Keli`iahonui (k) was:

63. i. Kawahinemakua (w)4 married Kiko (k). Kamehameha II [1819-1824] was born in 1797 in Hilo, Hawai`i, KOH; [Kamehameha's seventeenth child]. He married Kalanipauahi (w), daughter of Pauli Ka`ōleiokū (k) and Keōuawahine (w). He married Auhea Kekāuluohi (w), daughter of High Chief Kaihe`ekai (k) and Nāmāhanaikaleleokalani (w). He married Kīna`u (w), daughter of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Kaheihemāile (w). He married Kamehamalu (w), daughter of Kamehameha I [1795-1819] and Kaheihemāile (w). He married Keahikuni (w). He died on 14 Jul 1824 in England; [of measles]. He was also known as Kalani-Kaleiaimoku-o-Kaiwikapu-o-La`amea-i-Kauikawekiu-Ahilapalapa-Keali`ikauinamoku-o-Kahekili-Kalaninui-i-Mamao-Iolani-i-Ka-Liholiho. He was also known as `Iolani (k). He was also known as Liholiho Kamehameha (k). He was also known as Kalanikualiholiho (k). He was also known as Kalani-Kaleiaimoku-o-Kaiwikapu-o-Laamea-i-Kauikawekiu-Ahilapalapa-Kealiikauinamoku-o-Kahekili-Kalani-nui-i-Mamao-Iolani-i-Ka-Liholiho Kamehameha II. He was also known as Kalaninui Liholiho (k). There were no known issue of any of Liholiho's 5 spouses. Liholiho had the naha and ni`au pi`o kapus. He is buried at Mauna `Ala, Kamehameha crypt (makai vault).

There were no known children of Anna3 Keahikuni-i-Kekau`ōnohi and Kamehameha II [1819-1824].

The only known child of Anna3 Keahikuni-i-Kekau`ōnohi and Keaupuni (k) was:

64. i. Abigail4 Maheha was born in 1825 in Uakula, Kaua`i, KOH. She married Kamehameha V [1863-1872], son of Kekūana`ō`a (k) and Kīna`u (w). Levi Ha`alele`a was born either 1822 or 1828 in Lahaina, Maui, KOH. He married Amoe Ululani Kapukalakala `Ena, daughter of John Liwai Kalaniopu`uikapali-o-Molilele-ma-wai-o-Ahukini-Kā`u-Hawai`i `Ena and Kaikilani`ali`iwahineopuna (w), in 1858. He died on 2 Oct 1864 in Honolulu, O`ahu, KOH. He was buried in Kawaiaha`o Church Cemetery, Honolulu.

There were no known children of Anna3 Keahikuni-i-Kekau`ōnohi and Levi Ha`alele`a.

31. Puahau Kauhimakaoakalani Keanaokalani (w)3 (Kahiwa2 Kānekapōlei (w), 1 Kamehameha I) married Ernest Pi`imauna. She was also known as Puahau (w). She was also known as Puahaunapuoko (w).

Ernest Pi`imauna was also known as Pi`imauna (k).

The four known children of Puahau Kauhimakaoakalani Keanaokalani (w)3 and Ernest Pi`imauna were as follows:

65. i. Hannah Hanamua Hale-o-Naihe4 Pi`imauna married

Antone de Bright.

66. ii. Ernest Pi'imauna II.

67. iii. Victoria Pi'imauna married Matthew Aiu.

68. iv. Ernestine Pi'imauna.

32. Kumukamali'i3 Pālama (k) (2 Ha'aloa (k), 1 Kamehameha I) was born in 1825. He married Pau'ula Kaukua, daughter of Kaukua (k) and Kaupaoi (w). He died on 17 May 1872 in Hanapepe, Kaua'i, KOH.

Pau'ula Kaukua was born in 1833 in Hanapēpē, Kaua'i, KOH. She was also known as Pau'ula (w).

The six known children of Kumukamali'i3 Pālama (k) and Pau'ula Kaukua were as follows:

i. Waihowale4 Pālama was born in 1852.

ii. Kaipuwai Pālama was born in 1858.

iii. Keka'au Pālama was born in 1861.

69. iv. John Keli'ihanakula Pālama was born on 26 Apr 1863 in Koloa, Kaua'i, KOH. He married Kaluaipu'ulua Hanahana in 1884. He died on 16 Sep 1923 at age 60.


As a professor of international law, the former Secretary of the UN Human Rights Committee, co-author of book, *The United Nations Human Rights Committee Case Law 1977-2008*, and currently serving as the UN Independent Expert on the promotion of a democratic and equitable international order, I have come to understand that the lawful political status of the Hawaiian Islands is that of a sovereign nation-state in continuity; but a nation-state that is under a strange form of occupation by the United States resulting from an illegal military occupation and a fraudulent annexation. As such, international laws (the Hague and Geneva Conventions) require that governance and legal matters within the occupied territory of the Hawaiian Islands must be administered by the application of the laws of the occupied state (in this case, the Hawaiian Kingdom), not the domestic laws of the occupier (the United States).

Based on that understanding, in paragraph 69(n) of my 2013 report (A/68/284) to the United Nations General Assembly I recommended that the people of the Hawaiian Islands — and other peoples and nations in similar situations — be provided access to UN procedures and mechanisms in order to exercise their rights protected under international law. The adjudication of land transactions in the Hawaiian Islands would likewise be a matter of Hawaiian Kingdom law and international law, not domestic U.S. law.

I have reviewed the complaint submitted in 2017 by Mme Routh Bolomet to the United Nations Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, pointing out historical and ongoing plundering of the Hawaiians' lands, particularly of those heirs and descendants with land titles that originate from the distributions of lands under the authority of the Hawaiian Kingdom. Pursuant to the U.S. Supreme Court judgment in the *Paquete Habana* Case (1900),

U.S. courts have to take international law and customary international law into account in property disputes. The state of Hawaii courts should not lend themselves to a flagrant violation of the rights of the land title holders and in consequence of pertinent international norms. Therefore, the courts of the State of Hawaii must not enable or collude in the wrongful taking of private lands, bearing in mind that the right to property is recognized not only in U.S. law but also in Article 17 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted under the leadership of Eleanor Roosevelt.

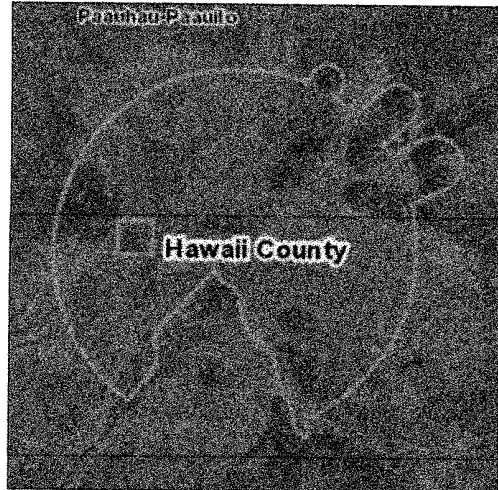

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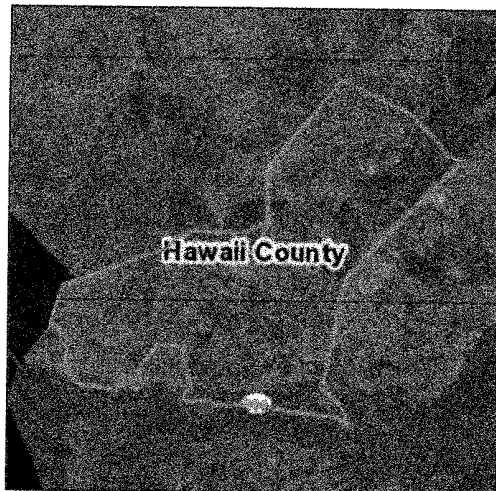

Dear Governor Ige:

At its meeting on August 29, 2019, the Council on Revenues raised its forecast for growth of the State General Fund tax revenue in fiscal year (FY) 2020 from 4.0% to 4.1%. The Council also changed its growth forecast for FY 2021 and FY 2022 to 3.0% and 4.0% for FY 2023 through FY 2026. The change reflects the expectation of economic headwinds in the coming year.

The Council believes that Hawaii's economy continues to be strong but cited uncertainty about the future. The Council discussed the economic and fiscal impact of Honolulu County's Ordinance 19-18, which increases the enforcement capabilities of the county to regulate transient accommodation units. The Department of Taxation briefed the members on the revenue impacts of legislation passed during 2019. In addition, the Director of Taxation discussed additional efforts that the State was taking to expedite deposits and improve tax collections.

Concerns were expressed that the economy may have reached the end of its current expansionary cycle during the seven-year budget window. The Council noted that Hawaii visitor arrivals, job counts, and construction activities are all continuing strong and that current business sentiment in the state remains positive. However, members expressed concern that on the national and global level, future storm clouds and uncertainty remain on the horizon, with the inverted yield curve (where interest rates on long-term debt instruments have a lower yield than short-term debt instruments) appearing, which normally preceded U.S. recessions in the past. In addition, members expressed concern about the impact of the U.S.-China trade war and a slowing global

economy. Finally, the Council also discussed the negative economic impact of Hawaii's population decline in recent years.

The new forecasts for the State General Fund tax revenues FY 2020 through FY 2026 are shown in the table below.

The Council adopted specific adjustments recommended by the Department of Taxation to reflect effects on General Fund tax revenues due to tax law changes enacted by the 2019 Legislature, including the following:

- Act 2, SLH 2019 deems marketplace facilitators the sellers of tangible personal property, intangible personal property, and services sold through the marketplace. The Act also deems sales of tangible personal property and services by sellers to the marketplace facilitator to be sales at wholesale. The Act is effective January 1, 2020. The estimated gain to the General Fund is \$4.0 million in FY2020, \$9.8 million in FY 2021, \$10.1 million in FY 2022, \$10.4 million in FY 2023, \$10.7 million in FY 2024, \$11.0 million in FY 2025, and \$11.3 million in FY 2026.
- Act 3, SLH 2019 establishes a new estate tax rate bracket for taxable estates exceeding \$10 million. The new bracket is 20%. The Act is effective April 4, 2019, and applies to decedents dying after December 31, 2019. The estimated gain to the General Fund is \$1.9 million in FY 2021, \$2.0 million in FY 2022, \$2.1 million in FY 2023, \$2.2 million in FY 2024, \$2.3 million in FY 2025, and \$2.4 million in FY 2026.
- Act 20, SLH 2019 imposes the transient accommodations tax on resort fees and defines resort fees as "any mandatory charge or surcharge imposed by an

operator, owner, or representative thereof to a transient for the use of the transient accommodation's property, services, or amenities." The Act is effective July 1, 2019. The estimated revenue gain to the General Fund is \$9.1 million in FY 2020, \$10.3 million in FY 2021, \$10.7 million in FY 2022, \$11.1 million in FY 2023, \$11.6 million in FY 2024, \$12 million in FY 2025, and \$12.4 million in FY 2026.

- Act 260, SLH 2019 establishes a new ship repair industry tax credit which is intended to offset costs incurred in constructing and placing into service a purpose-built floating drydock at Pearl Harbor for use by the United States Navy. The tax credit expires December 31, 2026. The Act also repeals the capital infrastructure tax credit. The Act is effective January 1, 2020, and applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2021. The expected net loss to the General Fund is \$6.0 million per year in FY 2023 to FY 2026.
- Act 261, SLH 2019 amends the tax credit for research activities such that references to the base amount contained in section 41 of the IRC do not apply, and credit may be taken based upon all qualified research expenses incurred in Hawaii without regard to the amount of expenses for previous years. The Act establishes an annual aggregate cap of \$5 million. The Act extends the tax credit from tax year 2020 through tax year 2024. The expected loss to the General Fund is \$5.0 million per year for FY 2021 to FY 2025.
- Act 275, SLH 2019 amends the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit by increasing the credit annual aggregate cap from \$35 million to \$50 million. The Act is effective July 10, 2019, and applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2018. The tax credit expires December 31, 2025. The expected loss to the General fund is \$15.0 million per year for FY 2020 to FY2026.

The Council also took into account provisions from earlier legislation, including the following:

- Act 27, SLH 2018 selectively conforms Hawaii income tax laws and estate tax laws to the Internal Revenue Code as of February 9, 2018, and as of December 31, 2017, respectively. The Act is effective June 7, 2018, and applies to taxable years beginning and to decedents dying after December 31, 2017. The estimated gain to the General Fund is estimated to be \$9.2 million in FY 2019, \$14.2 million in FY 2020, \$20.1 million in FY 2021, \$26.9 million in FY 2022, \$34.9 million in FY 2023, \$37.9 million in FY 2024, and \$37.1 million in FY 2025.
- Act 39, SLH 2018 increases the aggregate amount of the GET cost exemption for developing affordable rental housing from \$7 million to \$30 million per year. Extends the exemption from June 30, 2022, to June 30, 2030. The Act is effective

July 1, 2018, and applies retroactively to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017. The estimated loss to the General Fund is estimated to be \$23.0 million in FY 2019, \$23.0 million in FY 2020, \$23.0 million in FY 2021, \$23.0 million in FY 2022, \$30.0 million in FY 2023, \$30.0 million in FY 2024, and \$30.0 million in FY 2025.

- Act 41, SLH 2018 provides that a person is engaging in business in the State for the purpose of the general excise tax law if, in the current or immediately preceding calendar year, the person has \$100,000 or more in gross income, or two hundred or more separate transactions, from the sale of tangible personal property delivered in the State, services used or consumed in the State, or intangible property used in the State. The Act is effective July 1, 2018, and applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017. The estimated gain to the General Fund is estimated to be \$6.8 million in FY 2019, \$7.6 million in FY 2020, \$7.9 million in FY 2021, \$8.1 million in FY 2022, \$8.3 million in FY 2023, \$8.6 million in FY 2024, and \$8.9 million in FY 2025.
- Act 86, SLH 2018 reduces the allocations of TAT to the Convention Center Special Fund from \$26.5 million to \$16.5 million and the Tourism Special Fund from \$82 million to \$79 million. The Act is effective July 1, 2018. The estimated revenue gain to the General Fund is \$13 million per year from FY 2019 to FY 2025.
- Act 122, SLH 2018 increases the withholding on the amount realized from the disposition of Hawaii real property by nonresidents (HARPTA) from 5% to 7.25%. The Act is effective July 5, 2018, and applies to real estate dispositions that occur on or after September 15, 2018. The expected revenue gain is \$8.1 million in FY 2019 and \$2.6 million per year from FY 2020 to FY 2025.
- Act 211, SLH 2018 imposes the TAT on transient accommodations brokers, travel agencies, and tour packages that enter into arrangements to furnish transient accommodations at noncommissioned negotiated contract rates on their share of the proceeds. The Act is effective July 1, 2018, and applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2018. The expected revenue gain to the General Fund is \$14.7 million in FY 2019, \$36.6 million in FY 2020, \$38.0 million in FY 2021, \$39.3 million in FY 2022, \$40.6 million in FY 2023, \$42 million in FY 2024, and \$45.6 million in FY 2025.
- Act 107, SLH 2017 reinstates three tax rates and brackets (9.0%, 10.0%, and 11.0%) for the highest-income taxpayers imposed by Act 60, SLH 2009, for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017. The estimated gain to the General Fund is estimated to be \$50.7 million in FY 2019, \$53.3 million in FY

2020, \$55.9 million in FY 2021, \$58.7 million in FY 2022, \$61.6 million in FY 2023, and \$64.7 million in FY 2024.


- Act 107, SLH 2017 establishes a nonrefundable earned income tax credit (EITC) equal to 20 percent of the federal EITC. The tax credit applies to tax years 2018 through 2022. The estimated loss to the General Fund is estimated to be \$16.7 million in FY 2019, \$20.4 million in FY 2020, \$23.8 million in FY 2021, \$27.1 million in FY 2022, \$30.1 million in FY 2023, and \$0.0 in FY 2024.
- Act 107, SLH 2017 repeals the sunset date (December 31, 2017) for the amendments to the refundable food/excise tax credit by Act 223, SLH 2015. The estimated loss to the General Fund is estimated to be \$6.5 million per year from FY 2019 to FY 2024.
- Act 143, SLH 2017 amends the motion picture, digital media, and film production tax credit by limiting total amount of credit to \$35 million/year and extending the credit to January 1, 2026. Total tax credits claimed per qualified production shall not exceed \$15 million. The estimated revenue loss to the General Fund is \$35 million per year from FY 2020 to FY 2024.
- Act 54, SLH 2017 exempts certain affordable rental housing projects from the general excise and use tax. The legislation limits total amount of exemptions to \$7 million/ year starting July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2022. The expected revenue loss is \$7 million per year from FY 2019-2022.
- Act 1, SSLH 2017 increases the TAT rate from 9.25% to 10.25%, effective January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2030, and allocates the tax revenue generated from the increase to the Mass Transit Special Fund. The Act also increases the annual allocation to the counties from \$93 million to \$103 million, beginning in FY 2018. The expected revenue loss to the General Fund is \$10 million per year from FY 2018 to FY 2024.

The Department of Taxation has prepared a report (attached) detailing line-item forecasts for various components of the General Fund, reconciled to the Council's forecast growth rate for total General Fund tax revenues. The line-item forecasts include components, such as revenues from the General Excise Tax and from the Individual Income Tax that the Council does not forecast separately. Also, the Department of Budget and Finance has prepared the attached report to update its projections for change in non-tax and special tax revenues from its report on May 29, 2019.
